- Ensure your employees know the two closest exits to their work area, the location of the nearest fire alarm pull station and how to use it, and their responsibilities in a fire as laid out in your safety plan
- If you discover a fire, leave area immediately, close all doors behind you, activate the nearest fire alarm, take your keys and take the nearest exit to leave the building
- If you encounter smoke in the nearest exit, consider taking an alternate stairwell and crawl low under smoke
- Call 911 no matter how big the fire and never assume the call has been made
- Don't ever fight a fire if you have not been trained to use a fire extinguisher, you are unsure of the type of fire, the fire is spreading or your escape route is blocked by fire





# **Facts**

The flu (Influenza) is a serious, acute, respiratory disease caused by a virus.

The flu virus is spread by coughing, sneezing and direct contact with contaminated surfaces.

Symptoms of the flu (lasting 5 to 10 days) are cough (can last several weeks), fever, sore throat, chills, headache, muscle aches and fatigue (can last for several weeks).

Influenza can lead to pneumonia, hospitalization and even death especially in children, the elderly and those with chronic medical conditions.

Flu immunization can decrease workplace absenteeism due to upper respiratory illness by 43%.

The flu virus can live up to 48 hours on phones, door handles, keyboards and clothing.

The flu vaccine cannot give you the flu.

# Do your part in preventing a fire at work



## Wiring

- Check and replace any electrical cords that have cracked insulation or broken connectors
- Avoid octopus wiring
- Don't run extension cords across doorways or under rugs
- Avoid plugging more than one extension cord into an outlet
- Only use Canadian Standards Association (CSA) approved power bars

## **Appliances**

- Only use CSA approved appliances
- Leave enough space for air heaters and other equipment such as computer terminals and copy machines
- Keep all appliances a safe distance from combustible materials
- Always turn off or unplug appliances after using them

#### **Arson**

- Be aware of building security procedures.
   Report vandalism and notify security and/or police of suspicious behaviour and visitors
- Lock doors after working hours
- Ensure areas around your building are free of combustibles and are well lit
- Keep all halls, lobbies and areas used by the public clear of obstructions

Note: Arson is one of the leading causes of fire in the workplace
